West Union City Council met February 6, 2023, at 6:00 P.M. in Council Chambers with Mayor Cameron Granger presiding. The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance	Present: Croal, McElree, Miller, and Smith. Absent – Gumm
Approval of the Agenda	Motion was made by Croal, seconded by Miller, to approve the agenda as presented. All Aye. Carried.
Approval of Minutes	Motion was made by Miller, seconded by McElree, to approve the January 30th, 2023 minutes as presented. All Aye. Carried.
Approve Changing Insurance to Trust With Cottingham & Butler	Braydon Fisher and Tim Alexander presented information to change our current Wellmark insurance into a trust with other municipalities and options for the City to buy down premium and self fund a higher deductible. Motion was made by Croal, seconded by Miller, to approve moving under the trust with Cottingham and Butler, at the \$5,000/\$10,000 deductible plan effective March 1, 2023. All Aye. Carried.
Resolution 2023-19 Approving PPE #4 And CO#3 to Granger For Palmer Apt. Sponsored Project	Jon Biederman and Paige have been working with the funding partner on the wetness of the lower drainage area and will be requesting to add sedge plants that can handle the water better. Rest of the project has all turned out well. Motion was made by Croal, seconded by McElree, to approve PPE #4 for \$3,229.92 and Change Order #3 for a decrease of \$1,755 for retaining wall quantity to Granger Construction. All Aye. Carried.
Budget Review	Council discussed numbers for FY23-24 budget. Johansen will work directly with General Fund departments to decrease that deficit, and will redo the insurance numbers with the new quote from the trust and bring back next meeting.
Approve Liquor Licenses- BP Express And Dollar General	Motion was made by Smith, seconded by Miller, to approve liquor license renewal for Dollar General and new license for new owners at BP Express. All Aye. Carried.
Approve Credit on UB Bills Due to Broken Pipes	Two residents have called regarding broken water pipes causing high water usage and are asking for assistance on the bills. After some discussion, Motion was made by McElree, seconded by Miller, to stay consistent with the past and give 50% off sewer above normal usage on both, but also put together a policy that the City is not responsible on future incidences, unless extenuating circumstances of which they need to come to council to discuss. All Aye. Carried.

Adjourn	With no further business to bring before the Council, a motion was made by Smith, seconded by Miller, to adjourn. All Aye. Carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:05 pm.
